Entry Requirements

64 UCAS points from a combination of the following:

- Minimum of two A Levels
- Level 3 Extended Diploma
- GCSE English grade C or 4 is desirable but not compulsory

- GCSE Maths at grade C or 4 is desirable but not compulsory
- An Access to HE qualification

All candidates will attend an interview, which includes presentation of a portfolio of work or live audition. Applicants without formal qualifications but who possess a portfolio of evidence and experience may be considered via interview.
